Be sold out completely to loving and living inside of that love.

Is your love for God merely intellectual? It’s not enough because we change our minds constantly based on circumstances. Is your love for God only emotional? This, too, is not enough. You must have a reason, a basis for your love. Is your love for God something you pursue with due diligence, with every fiber of your being through endless works of righteousness that sap you of your strength at times? Hmm, this is dangerous alone. Going through the motions of loving God will soon replace a joyous relationship with sour-faced religiosity. Is your love for God merely soulish? If so, you

will constantly be at war with your flesh as you fluctuate over what you love most. Many things appeal to our soul, but it is difficult to love them all equally at the same time. Something will suffer.

We've got to have a made-up mind to give our hearts completely to God, ordering our soul to resist the urges of the flesh with all of our strength. Our capacity to give and receive love from others depends on it.

Pouring Out

Love your neighbor as yourself.

Luke 10:27

O ops! There it is! If you are commanded to love your neighbor as you love yourself, then that means you have got to love yourself. Not in a New Age, humanistic sort of way, but God's way. What do you do with something that you love? You take good care of it. Revere it. Understand its worth and treat it accordingly. You pamper it. You make sure it always looks its best. You don't do anything to harm it or put it in harm's way. Uh-huh, we're talking about you, girl.

Do you treat others the same? Think about it. If you are always putting yourself down, you are most likely being very critical of others as well. You see, God understood that you could only treat the next person as well as you treat yourself. For many years I struggled with my weight. I would look in the mirror and criticize my body. I would starve it. Talk sternly to it and tell it to line up. I

found myself growing larger. One day the Lord spoke to me and said, “Michelle, be kind to your body. It’s the only one you have. Love it and it will serve you.” So I began looking at myself in a different way. I started noting the good parts of me. I began to celebrate my body. I took it for regular massages. Selected good foods for it. I began to listen to my body. It had been reacting badly to many of the things I was putting into my system. I no longer forced these things on my body. I ate what it craved in moderation. I took it for walks. Began to seek clothing that complemented its good points. Guess what? I began to lose weight! I started to feel better and look better. I loved my body and my body was loving me back. Are you going where I’m taking you? To a land of celebration.

If you can train yourself to respond to yourself with kindness, it will naturally overflow to others. When you love yourself, you won’t be as self-conscious. You will be free in spirit to look beyond yourself and respond to the needs of others wholeheartedly. As you begin to pour out sensitivity and responsiveness to others around you, fulfillment and joy will flood your being. You will rejoice in the positive and find grace for the negative. Remember, what a woman sows is definitely what she will reap. Therefore, sow love.

A True Love Connection

Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death—even death on a cross! Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

PHILIPPIANS 2:5-11

To think that one person would do all of that for a relationship is astounding. The only way you can humble yourself to the extent Jesus did (in order to clear the way for us to have a romance with Him throughout

eternity) is to know and love yourself and know your personal worth first. Consider the analogy of bungee jumping, if you will. No bungee jumpers are going anywhere until they know the line that keeps them from crashing is secure. They know that although they are flinging themselves out into the open air, descending from the highest heights to the lowest lows, they are connected and guaranteed a safe return.

When we are truly experiencing a love connection with God, secure within ourselves that we are lovable, we are able to take risks to love others—without expecting anything in return. Unconditional love. There is something so freeing about not relying on anyone's love to validate you! You've already got all the love you need. Anything else from others is merely icing on the cake of your heart. You are not empty. Not starving. Not in desperate need. Therefore, you make choices to give love to those around you without requiring anything in return. Of course, this is the secret to getting the love you want. Your openhandedness frees others to make the choice to love you back. Unconditional release attracts ardent commitment, but conditional neediness smothers the promise of love. It snuffs the life and joy out of love because others are being robbed of their power to choose. So stay connected to the love vine and freely give its fruit. Freely give and freely receive.

En Garde!

Guard your heart more than any treasure, for it is the source of all life.

PROVERBS 4:23 NEB

If you love yourself, you will protect what is dear. That would be your heart. Your heart condition affects everything concerning your life. Guard it—as in care for, preserve, keep out of harm's way, nurture. Though the heart must take risks when it comes to love, those risks should be thought out, not impulsively executed. Consider the cost but also consider the rewards. Observe the fine line but don't allow it to trip you. The heart is the seat of decision making in your being. Therefore, consider your offerings before you give them, measure them into servings that don't overwhelm or deplete. Give of yourself as an offering to God, not in search of something

Ask Him to hold it and then dare to dance.

ROMANS 8:27-28

We, as females, also have these wonderful traits which must be balanced in order for us to gain joyful results from the decisions we make. Perhaps our Shulamite sister knew all of this when she shared this caution with her friends. Because we see things so quickly, we are tempted to move ahead of God. To stir up love, so to speak, if we even sense the possibility. But we must be willing to adapt to the feelings and desires of others. Love is flexible. Love is patient. Love that is really there isn't going anywhere; therefore, take your time. Test it. Observe it to discern its intentions. Is it lust or is it love? Only time will tell.

Think of it this way: You've been alone this long, why hurry now? Wait and get it right. Allow the heart to settle into a realistic space. Don't push, cajole, or try to make things happen before the appointed time. Remember there is a season for everything, including examination. Over and over Scripture encourages us to be very clear on where we are going and what we are doing. It is important to use your head, as well as your heart, in the issues of love. For something that is lasting, there should be no rush.

Here you have two authorities talking on the subject of love. God and Wisdom. What they have to say holds true for us but it is something we must know in our very beings so that we don't grow sensitive to what we perceive as rejection.

God loves everyone. He calls and woos us to come and enjoy a relationship with Him. But only those who respond and look for Him find true love and experience the full benefit of what being in relationship with Him is all about. There is an intimacy that is enjoyed with those who respond to His loving embrace. What about the relationships in your life? Do you show a similar love? Yet we're also called to be discerning. Love everyone, yes, but only those who treasure and respond to your love should have the benefit of touching your heart in intimate places and have full access to your friendship, care, and affections.

Wisdom says that people who don't appreciate her lose out. It's not her problem, it's their problem. They are not ready for the real thing! All men you meet will not be ready for you. They will not appreciate what you have to offer; that is their problem and their loss. Feel sorry for them and all that they will be missing. This means that you must be convinced that you are the good thing that a man must find. He must seek you and do the work to claim you before he reaps the benefits.

If you are struggling with believing that you are a prize, a pearl of great price, then the work must begin there. Work it out, sister, until you believe

it! Because the bottom line is you don't lose anything if someone doesn't recognize the gem that you are. The passersby are the ones who lose.

Revealing Light

Jesus said to them, "If God were your Father, you would love me, for I came from God and now am here."

JOHN 8:42

Light attracts light. Know that only those who love the Light, or are seeking the Light, will be attracted to you. Continue walking toward the Light, and they will either join you or fade away. Even though Satan sends assignments into our lives—people who don't have our best in mind—they cannot remain because darkness cannot remain in the presence of light. Another wonderful reason to have no fear and simply love. God will take care of your heart if you let Him.

I recall meeting a very interesting man a while back. He was too good to be true. So I submitted him to God in prayer. Unless it is his heart's desire to draw closer to God, he will not have more than a passing attraction for you. Don't get a complex. Let your life work for you. Know that what appears to be man's rejection is merely God's intervention and protection.

Because of the increase of wickedness, the love of most will grow cold.

MATTHEW 24:12

The LORD will fulfill his purpose for me; your love, O LORD, endures forever — do not abandon the works of your hands.

PSALM 138:8

I can be discouraging sometimes when we step back to take a mental scan of what is available on the man front. To tell the truth, the pickings look very slim. However, what your eyes see and what you have experienced in the past have absolutely nothing to do with God's plans and His ability to perform His promises. Perhaps we need to take our eyes off of the horizon line of our own rationalizations and get them fixed on the promises of He who knows where every good man is hidden.

Faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see, according to Hebrews 11:1. Your hope cannot be in men or in the surplus that we cannot see. It has to be in God's Word to you. He is the only man who cannot lie. If He says it, He will do it. Go on, dare to hope again and know that He will finish every project He has started on your behalf. He will make sure that you have the love and companionship you need to live a joyful and productive life. And that, my friend, is that!

Love Notes from God

If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and surrender my body to the flames, but have not love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the

truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails.

But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but when perfection comes, the imperfect disappears.

When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put childish ways behind me. Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known. And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love. Follow the way of love...(1 Corinthians 13-14:1)

Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you...then your reward will be great...Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful (Luke 6:27-28,35-36).

Keep Hope Alive

And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us.

ROMANS 5:5

Where we place our hope is crucial to our joy level. If hope deferred or unfulfilled makes our hearts sick, how do we allow this to happen in our lives? Perhaps we are hoping for the wrong thing. This is where trust comes in and God’s love becomes enough for us until He chooses to add to it through the arms of the one He has appointed to love us the way He does. Hmmm...sounds good to me. And definitely worth the wait.

Keep the Faith

The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love.

GALATIANS 5:6

Perhaps we have put the cart before the horse. We need to have faith first, love second. Why? To possess love without faith would leave us in torment, always checking to make sure that love is there. But the beautiful thing about love is you are able to rest in it. It permeates our lives in ways that cannot be denied when we have faith. Love is intangible in a sense: You must have faith in order to enjoy it. It is like the wind. You can’t see it but you know it’s there. Every once in a while it breezes gently across your face. At moments, it whips your hair and cools you. The wind blows in different degrees and intensities, yet no one doubts its existence. It is a common belief that the wind is real and manifests itself as it pleases. And we allow it to. But perhaps only because we have no control over it.

Love is like the wind. Every day is not a day filled with passion. Love ebbs and flows. Without faith, we would constantly press to substantiate love’s existence in the hearts of those around us or a significant other. No, somewhere along the way we must choose faith over love. Believe that it is there in bottomless measures whether we feel it or not. And when the love of others is not apparent, God’s love is faithfully present to fill the void in us to overflowing so that we never lack. Faith proclaims love is...love is... love simply is. Faith removes the pressure to find proof and that place of resting gives us immense satisfaction and joy.

The Language of Love

This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers...Let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth.

1 J OHN 3:16,18

Many would say they feel loved based on what others do for them. One fondly remembers the day someone gave her flowers. Or soothed her pain. Or took the time to go out of his way to do something for her. She reflects upon these moments as expressions of true love. But can you really tell? Some people are nice for different reasons. To gain approval. To prove their own worth. To get something they want from you.

The true language of love is willing sacrifice. This is seldom thought of as we pursue finding the one true love of our lives. How much are you willing to sacrifice to have what you want? Your life as you know it to accommodate the interest of another? A dream that would interfere with your beloved's? This is important. This is big. Words are one thing, but actions are superior, for they reveal the heart of God to those around us. If we truly love and do nothing to show it, then we lie to ourselves as well as to others.

After you've learned the language of love, you will have no trouble translating it into real-life love experiences right where you live, right now.

Love in Action

Live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

EPHESIANS 5:2

Every single day we get countless opportunities to live a life of love. To reach out to someone. To lift a spirit. To encourage a soul. To simply compliment someone who might not even be aware of her own beauty that day. The ability to make others smile is amazing. It is like giving flowers to strangers who would be overwhelmed by such a pleasant surprise.

Christ came with the determination to liberate the captive, heal the sick and wounded, and ransom all of mankind. Giving of Himself was His love language. What is your love language? Is it treating someone to lunch? Drying someone's tears? Making someone feel better? If we are imitators of Christ, our love language should also be giving to the point of sacrifice. At times, giving of yourself will not be convenient. Take the time to listen anyway. Give anyway. Reach out anyway. Love anyway. The sense of accomplishment after the deed is done cannot be measured. The returns are intangible but felt in bountiful measures. The joy of knowing your life matters. Your gift of love matters...and most of all you matter because you've made yourself available as a vessel to continue the conversation that God wants to have with those around you...and for that you are truly loved.

Going the Distance

May the Lord direct your hearts into God's love and Christ's perseverance.

2 THESSALONIANS 3:5

Love and perseverance go hand in hand because all love must be tested. Ooh, we hate that word! It speaks of trial and pain and all the things that we don't like. Yet this is why love must be firmly entrenched in God first. When our hearts are firmly entrenched in His loving hands, kept safe and secure from all that can buffet them, then we will be able to weather the storms that try our love. Allow God, and the knowledge of His love for you, to strengthen your resolve to love with abandon.

Remember, the enemy of our souls wants to rob you of the love that you should experience. He wants to destroy your heart and kill your expectations of ever having a divine love life. Don't let him. Stand firm in your determination to love. No matter how difficult the way may be. No matter how fearsome the journey. Know that you will never come out of a love experience empty handed. There is always a priceless lesson or a life-changing experience birthed in the exchange. Try to have the determination that Christ had to reach and embrace us.

Love goes the distance to the point of death if necessary. Love toughs it out and makes it through the difficult places. Love does not give up! JUDE 2

answer. So ask, and ask often, for mercy, peace, and love—not just in small portions, but in abundance.

Just Wait

Keep yourselves in God's love as you wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to bring you to eternal life.

JUDE 21

This is great advice across the board. Keep yourself in God's love as you wait for anything! A true love relationship. A promotion in your job. The opportunity you've always wanted. The list goes on and on. If you are kept in His love, you won't grow weary or anxious. The assurance of His ever-present love will keep you in remembrance of the fact that He knows what's best for you and He's working on it. If you've asked Him for bread, surely He won't give you a stone. Sometimes in our haste to put out the gnawing fire of longing within ourselves, we select stones hoping that they are bread. Yet God, in His omniscience is able to call a stone a stone. So passionate is He about giving you the best, He will discard the stones rather than serve them to you.

No, my friend, He, like the owner of a renowned vineyard, will serve nothing before it is time. Wait on Him. Know that He loves you. He wants what is best for you and will not settle for anything less than that even if you will. Just wait...

A friend chastised me once by telling me that waiting on God is not climbing into His lap then peering over His shoulder every five minutes to see if the thing I desire is coming. I didn't want to hear it at the time, but it is true. Waiting on God is not just enjoying being in the center of His love, it is also serving Him joyfully to the point of distraction. Yes, you can actually be distracted from your own longings if you focus on pleasing Him! His pleasure becomes your desire and it transcends all the other things you have been hoping and praying for. As your heart joins with His, certain desires will change, but those that are in accordance with God's desires will be fulfilled. The bottom line? Joy. Here, now, and forevermore.

Truth in Love

Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins.

1 P ETER 4:8

Do everything in love.

1 C ORINTHIANS 16:14

If we are motivated by what we want from people, our love flow will go up and down to the point of being maddening. We will be besieged by the shortcomings of others and their disappointing behavior toward us. But if our focus becomes simply loving, grace will come to deal with the weaknesses of others. And they will respond to that grace with changes we find miraculous.

When we love unconditionally, we release people to be who they are. In loving, we finally see that no one was made to be all that we expect them to be, and we accept that fact graciously. Love is not blind, contrary to what the world propagates. It is realistic and forgiving. It does not excuse sin. It simply re-focuses what threatens to become judgment in search of a solution. A soft answer turns away wrath, while an offended brother or sister is harder to win than a fortified city...If we come from a place of love, even in correction, a spoonful of sugar will help the medicine go down.

Have you been offended? Speak the truth in love. Been disappointed and let down by someone's attitude or behavior? Speak the truth in love. Feel as if you are giving more than you are getting? Speak the truth in love and be open to the other person's response. It will give you cues on how to measure your offerings. Love, but give others the time and space to love you back. Do not demand, do not push, be honest in your sentiments, and don't berate others for what they are not capable of or willing to do at the time. Release them to love. See the truth and accept it lovingly. Strengthen rather than tear down through harsh criticism. Cover them with encouragement rather than expose their weaknesses. That is the Holy

Spirit's job, and He does it very well. This is an exercise of self-discipline that can prove difficult and sometimes leave you feeling powerless. But the results are sweet and lasting. Your healthy heart will thank you for it. You might ask in exasperation as you ponder the situation in your life, "Well, what's a girl to do?" My answer is, "Take a step back and love, girl. Simply love and let everything else fall into, or out of, place."

She discovered that all those wonderful feelings of oneness were completed by God, not Adam. When God pronounced the consequences for her disobedience, the damage became apparent.

Now Eve would long for Adam to fill the space that God had once filled. Of course, he would never be able to do this. He wasn't created to take God's place in her heart. Her desire for completion and fulfillment from her man

would become overwhelming to the point of ruling over her. Her desire for her husband would rule over her. There it is. Still being perpetuated today. It is important for you to know that because of the death of Jesus Christ this fate no longer belongs to you. Your desire for intimacy with Christ cancels out the void. It puts you back in the driver's seat of your desires. Desires should not dominate you. They should not affect your joy level.

How much time, energy, and emotional stress do you put into worrying about having a mate? How much of your conversation is about a man or the lack thereof? Are your friends strangely silent or do they sound like a broken record when you bring up the subject? It is time to take those desires and lay them at the foot of the cross, where they can no longer reign over you. Allow the Lord to fill the void within you. Accept the liberty you now have to be an independent woman in Him.

Remember, "the two shall become one." In God's equation, two halves do not make a whole. Two whole people are able to become one. Two halves result in one big mess of a relationship that may or may not stand the test of time and trial. Allow God to be the answer to the missing piece in your life. Get full. Get happy. Get whole. And then get ready to receive the one who can only add to the joy that is already resident within you.

Never Alone

The LORD God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him."

GENESIS 2:18

Interesting! Adam never broached the subject of needing a mate with God. God decided when it was time. Have you allowed God to work His schedule in your life or have you put Him on deadline? Notice that God did not say "It is not good for the man to be lonely." Adam was alone, in the sense of not having a human companion, but he was not lonely. There is a difference. Adam dwelt in the presence of God and felt no lack. As we dwell in the presence of God, He divinely decides what we are lacking. We should be so caught up in the sufficiency of His goodness that what we lack isn't even apparent to us. Allow me to give you the true definition of lonely

—the absence of God. You cannot miss what you've never had. Therefore Adam did not miss having someone else in his life. He already had someone—God.

There is a peace that few know. The joy of reveling in God's company. Once you experience it you won't allow anyone or anything to mess it up. It will keep you from accepting just anything or anyone in your life. Why? Because though you are alone, you are not lonely.

Adam had been given an assignment. Be fruitful, multiply, have dominion over every living thing, and subdue all things in the earth. In other words, add to God's creation, supervise it, and keep it all in order. Adam did a good job with the latter, but he needed help with the first part of the assignment. He could not be fruitful and multiply on his own. It would take a special person to walk in sync with Adam and help him complete his God-ordained mission. This person had to be fashioned especially for him.

What you need to understand is that the man God has for you has been given an assignment. God has spent your whole life fashioning you into a helper that will be suitable for your mate. He is already out there. God is finishing a work in him as well before joining you together. Allow God to train him, groom him, and prepare him for you. That does not mean that he will be perfect when he arrives. Whole, yes; perfect, no. On an assignment, yes; able to complete it alone, no. Are you getting this? Marriage and having a mate are not just about you. It is about a partnership for God's glory. To the furtherance of completing His plan. In the meantime, learn to discern the difference between being alone and being lonely.

Perfect Match

So the man gave names to all the livestock, the birds of the air and all the beasts of the field. But for Adam no suitable helper was found.

GENESIS 2:20

When we give names to the people and circumstances in our lives we come up with some pretty interesting things. Let's see, we call Mr. Wrong "Mr. Right." Things that are unacceptable we say are "workable"...shall I go on?

What was the point of this whole naming exercise? It gave man practice in exercising his authority. After all, God didn't change the names of anything after Adam named them.

Let me tell you something, my dear sister. If you want to name Mr. Wrong "Mr. Right," God will not interrupt you. He has given you free will and authority to exercise it as you may. Until you are ready to hear what God has to say about that man in your life He will let you name him, claim him, and frame him anyway you please. Don't mistake God's silence for approval.

Yes, Adam named the animals, but it was obvious they were all coupled up as like kind. There was none that bore a resemblance to him. None of the animals could help him complete the assignment that God had given him.

So your mate hasn't shown up yet? Perhaps he is still naming the animals. We've named a few ourselves—various dogs, frogs, and beasts, but when the exercise is over the verdict is the same—there is none suitable. Accept that and wait until there is. Don't try to dress up an animal and make it into something it isn't. Call a spade a spade. "This person cannot help me be all that God has created me to be." Name them what they are—"not for you"—and move on in the expectancy that God has created one of like kind for you.

Let It Rest

So the LORD God caused the man to fall into a deep sleep; and while he was sleeping, he took one of the man's ribs and closed up the place with flesh. Then the LORD God made a woman from the rib he had taken out of the man, and he brought her to the man. The man said, "This is now bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called 'woman', for she was taken out of man."

GENESIS 2:21-23

So...after Adam had named all the animals, he may have noticed all had mates but himself. It was then that God caused him to enter into a state of rest. Perhaps this is the secret for us. If you have found it difficult to be at

rest about this mate thing, ask God to help you enter into His rest. Adam slept and God went to work. This could be a part of the secret. Let go and let God! He seems to do a better job when we are out of the way.

Believe you me, when God goes about securing your mate, that man will be perfect for you. He will be fashioned to complete not you (that should already have happened in Christ), but the puzzle of your life. The missing pieces of your character and personality. He will take you to another level of relationship with Christ because, through this man, you will learn the secret of true oneness. He will be your mirror. Do you know why he will be able to reflect and reveal who you are? Because he will know you. God will put a knowing of who you are—your needs and desires—deep within his spirit, and he will recognize that you are his missing rib! The one he has been looking for.

You will not need to inform him that you're the one for him because he will know that instinctively. Eve did not go up to Adam and tell him, "Wake up, Adam. The Lord said you are my husband!" She merely stood in the frame of God's timing and allowed herself to be recognized. She stood secure in the fact that she was a complete and desirable work crafted by the Master's hand. Fearfully and wonderfully made. Why wouldn't he want her? She was perfect for him. Assigned to help him. To be a physical extension of God's love for him. And God didn't wake Adam up a minute before He was completely finished with Eve.

How do you think he recognized her? First, God presented her to him. Which means God revealed her to him. There was no denying it. No need for fasting, praying, and getting friends in spiritual agreement to convince him on her part. She came complete with everything that Adam realized he wanted and needed. Eve experienced the joy of being recognized and chosen by Adam.

Are you allowing God to finish you? Or are you rearranging His design? Are you submitting to the paces of training to be a suitable mate for your husband? Are you clear on your purpose as a woman, as a creation of the Most High God? Before you look for the man, be made perfect in God's love, know your assignment, and be equipped for the mission.

Back to the Garden

The man and his wife were both naked, and they felt no shame.

GENESIS 2:25

How refreshing it must have been. Two people, Adam and Eve, standing before one another with no past experiences, nothing to feel self-conscious about. All they could do was celebrate God and each other. No past mistakes stood between them. No doubts about their own desirability, worthiness for true love, lies entrenched in their psyche, bad examples of other failed relationships, nothing to weigh their love down. They were free to simply love! No one has been in such a state of Utopia since. However, God is willing to wash, heal, and restore what has been broken and bruised in our hearts and give us new beginnings. He is able to heal memories and speak words of truth about who we are in Him. We can return back to the Garden—whole, cleansed, unashamed, and no longer encumbered by our past.

Can we talk about excess baggage, pain, shame, and other things? Get rid of them. Take the time you have alone to sort through the baggage and get rid of things you cannot use to nurture the next potentially healthy relationship. Don't ruin a good man because of the last bad man in your life.

God wants us to be transparent with the man He presents us to. Vulnerable, trusting, and open to love. But we can only get there if we allow the Spirit of God to lead us beside His cool waters where we can rest and our faith can be restored. We can return to the Garden carrying no burdens, only a heart that is open to love.

A Good Thing

He who finds a wife finds what is good and receives favour from the LORD .

PROVERBS 18:22

Are you a good thing? Are you a well-rounded woman? Can you balance business with pleasure? Have you mastered the art of encouragement? Making a house a home? Cooking a meal that will find its way to his heart? Are you filled with wisdom and joy? Are your affairs set in order? Are your finances under control? Do you have something to bring to the party? Are you able to let a man be a man? Do you enjoy being a woman?

What is one way a man can obtain the favor of the Lord? Through having the right woman by his side. It is through her encouragement, inspiration, and quiet strength that a man can become more of what God created him to be. She creates an oasis for his mind. A place of refreshing for his spirit. A safe place for his heart to rest. A pleasant garden for his body. With all of this accomplished, a man is prepared to face the world. His head is together. This is a rare find. This one thing causes a woman's value to shoot up faster than the stock market on an exemplary day. Many are no longer virgins. There's no need to fret. Know and believe that you have been restored back to this state by the blood of the Lamb. It is now up to you to keep your restoration.

A garden locked up, a place of secret delights in his mind. Wonderful, tantalizing things to discover. He was looking forward to the day when he could taste the fruit of her love. To tap into her passion and feel it pour over him. My, my! This gives us a hint to the next thing that causes a man to value a woman. Her mystery. Has anyone ever told you the end of a movie

before you got to see and experience it for yourself? Kind of ruined it for you, didn't it? Well, when you give all that you have, including your body, too soon, it makes the love experience anticlimactic. It takes the fun out of it. It also decreases your value and his interest.

This same woman had brothers who asked her in Song of Songs if she was a door or a wall. If she was a door and had let other men enter her, they would enclose her in cedar, which was symbolic of putting her to death! But if she was a wall, keeping herself and not allowing any man into her, they would honor her with a tower of silver. You see the difference in value? One was worthy of discarding, the other was worthy of great reward in their eyes. She proudly proclaimed that she was a wall, her breasts were like towers because she could hold her head high with no shame. She brought contentment to her fiance because she could be trusted.

Want to get a man? Allow him to see the Holy Spirit at work in your life. Attract him with godliness. Leave it to his own imagination to take him to places that you cannot. Want to keep a man? Keep the garden gate locked until he has committed in the sight of witnesses to tending all that the garden holds.

Intimate Choices

Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ himself? Shall I then take the members of Christ and unite them with a prostitute? Never! Do you not know that he who unites himself with a prostitute is one with her in body? For it is said, "The two will become one flesh." But he who unites himself with the Lord is one with him in spirit. Flee from sexual immorality. All other sins a man commits are outside his body, but he who sins sexually sins against his own body. Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your body.

1 C ORINTHIANS 6:15-20

Some straight facts about your body. First, your body will never belong to just you. Right now it belongs to God. He paid for it. If you marry your

body will belong to your husband. When you've been left to look after something that belongs to someone else, it requires extra care. No one wants to present an article that has not been well kept back to its owner. Treat your body as if it is priceless—because it is. When visiting a museum, priceless articles are kept either under glass or heavily guarded. A sign usually warns, "Do Not Touch." The oils from the touch of observers would leave a residue on the painting or piece that would alter it and cause wear over time and decrease its value. In order to preserve the piece and ensure that its value appreciates, admirers must behold it from afar.

Second, you are bonded to whomever your body belongs to. It's called a soul tie. We are bonded to God through our union with Him through Christ Jesus. All that we are and all that we have belongs to Him. This is why, in His eyes, fornication is adultery. You are giving your body to someone who He has not chosen to love you in a committed marriage.

When you give your body to a man, you are now bound to him. If God is not the glue in the relationship, at some point in time the fragile bond you share in the flesh will break, leaving your spirit shattered. Because indulging in sexual intimacy is your choice, you do damage to yourself. After a soul tie is broken, you feel what is called in medical terms "phantom pain." This describes the sensation one feels after a person has had a member of their body severed or removed. This is what happens within the sexual union. Two become one in body and spirit. When one decides to leave, they are actually severing a portion of the other's spirit. The pain is excruciating and felt for endless teary nights.

If this is where you are right now, accept the reality of the pain and give it to God. Understand that weeping may endure for a night but joy comes in the morning. Hold out for healing, do not try to reattach yourself to this person in order to stop the ache. This will only bring greater pain later. There is no shortcut around the healing process. Walk with God, who is able to soothe and heal the frayed edges of your spirit and emotions. Keep pouring out your sorrow to Him until He's got it all. Keep your eye on the light at the end of the tunnel and take it one day at a time until you reach wholeness.

Third, you are not alone in the house called your body. The Holy Spirit resides there. He is involved in whatever you do with your body. Intimacy without consent is a violation. The Holy Spirit will never consent to sex outside of marriage. Keep this in mind and choose not to go against His wishes or grieve Him by dragging Him into something that is not pleasing to Him. This is a touchy subject (pardon the pun), but we must be sober in the days to come as weariness threatens to set in and temptation increases. This is about self-preservation and joyful living. Have a made-up mind not to compromise yourself. It's never worth the price tag.

Remember that whomever you yield to, you become their slave. Yielding is an act of worship. For those not in a relationship at this present time, make up your mind not to be bonded to a man until he has committed to you in marriage. Until then walk like a well-kept woman who understands that her body belongs to a King and knows no one is deserving of her crown jewels until he pays the price.

Real Talk About the "S" Word

(You got it, sex!)

1. God created it, Satan perverted it.
2. As noted relationship expert P. Bunny Wilson would say, "Sex is good when it is saved sex." That means God sits at the foot of your bed and applauds your union in the marriage bed, releasing you to be naked and unashamed in your celebration of love.
3. Sex before marriage negatively affects the trust factor after marriage. Self-control builds trust in one another's character.
4. Self-gratification will make it more difficult for your partner to please you. He will never be able to duplicate what you cause your body to grow used to.
5. Don't start anything that you shouldn't finish because you most likely will.

6. Oral sex, as the title suggests, is sex in case you were wondering. It is not an option for you as you wait.
7. Not only will you create a soul tie with anyone you have sex with, you will also create a physical dependency that might be stronger than your emotional pull to him. Therefore, you will keep returning to a man you don't even like because you are physically hooked. See the deception and cut the cord.
8. Intimacy without commitment is not a promise. It is a lie.

How to Handle Raging Hormones

Offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God — this is your spiritual act of worship.

ROMANS 12:1

The answer is simple. Press into a deeper place of worship with the Lord. For everything in the natural, there is a spiritual parallel. God will not leave you lacking in anything. What is sex? What is worship? They are both the act of giving all that you are and all that you have to the one that you love. Worship is the act of forgetting about yourself and focusing completely on God, the first and most important object of affection. As you seek to please His heart in worship and praise, delighting yourself in Him, all you lack will be forgotten. True and satisfying worship is where you reach out for more of Him to fill the empty places inside yourself. Our longing for love, for fulfillment, for peace, for joy, for greater intimacy—these desires are satisfied the closer we draw to Him. In drawing closer, we learn more of Him. And truly, to know Him is to love Him. But it goes even deeper than this.

In the King James Version of the Bible, when referring to a godly sexual union, it repeatedly says, “and he knew her,” speaking of deep intimacy where two are naked and unashamed, hiding nothing, being completely vulnerable and transparent to one another. “Adam knew Eve and she conceived.” When we “know” God, we make ourselves vulnerable and transparent before Him in praise and worship, pouring out all that is within

us to Him. We conceive of the fruit of the Spirit and proclaim Christ and His characteristics to the world.

That's the spiritual side of it. The natural side of why I encourage you to worship when you wake up in the middle of the night and you feel as if your body is attending a party you didn't know you were invited to is because worship redirects your thoughts. The body must submit to the mind. We need to bring every imagination captive and submit our thoughts to the Lord. When we do this, He fills our minds with peace, fulfillment, and satisfaction. The flesh will then be quieted. Why? Because the glory of God will overshadow the demands of the flesh as we turn our thoughts heavenward toward the Lover of our souls and surrender all our desires to Him.

Therefore, in your singleness, give it all to God. There is a place you can go to worship where you find yourself spent, but satisfied. Completely overcome with the fullness of His Spirit in intimate communion. Reach higher, dig deeper, stay in His presence longer, and let Him cover and fill you with His love. Then rest in His arms and let your sleep be sweet.

Get Your Own Man

But since there is so much immorality, each man should have his own wife, and each woman her own husband.

1 C ORINTHIANS 7:2

I am going to place a different emphasis on this scripture. Each woman should have her own husband , not anyone else's. I am going to hit this quickly and move on. The big "A" word, adultery , is a big no, no, not ever! I am saddened to see this going on in churches across the land. Women coveting other women's husbands, praying for their demise. I'm sure you don't know anyone like this, but I am sad to say I do. I have one thing to say: "Stop it!" You are treading on dangerous ground and heading straight toward excruciating heartbreak and disgrace.

The excuses are countless for how many a good sister finds herself in this spot. First, your own vulnerability is at an all-time high. The devil has

convinced you that due to the man shortage your husband is in prison or already married. It ain't necessarily so. Just because you haven't seen him doesn't mean that he doesn't exist. Next, some nice married man begins to give you the attention you've been longing for. He begins to share the problems he is having with his wife. He paints a terrible picture of his tortured, loveless existence with this woman. You think to yourself, He's just not happy. He's merely existing in a marriage that has long been over. Puh-leeze! This line has been used so much, it is not just tired, it is exhausted . For everyone I've counseled, the line has been the same. Then the enemy comes whispering that this married man deserves better and you are that something better. You would know how to love him the way he needs to be loved...the rest is history. So here we go...

Tips on how to avoid falling into adultery:

1. Know your own vulnerability.
2. Walk in accountability with a trusted and godly friend who will speak the truth in love to you.
3. Do not entertain married men in close quarters or intimate settings.
4. Do not allow intimate conversations with married men.
5. If you cannot be friends with his wife, you cannot be friends with him. The two are one whether they like one another or not.
6. Do not entertain negative conversations about his wife. If he confesses problems to you, refer him to a godly brother. You will quickly see how interested he is in solving them.
7. Remember that when a man has an unfaithful spirit toward his wife, he will also be unfaithful to you. Even if you manage to capture him for a while you will always live with the torment of not being able to trust him completely
8. You must agree with God that adultery is sin and highly offends the One who loves you most. It displays a lack of trust on your part for His

ability to provide love and a companion for you.

9. Remain watchful over your own emotions and don't ignore the red flags that the Holy Spirit waves.

Want to be happy and stay happy?

Be patient and get your own husband.

Missionary Dating

Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness?

2 C ORINTHIANS 6:14

If you were dating someone and he didn't like your mother, father, child (if you have one), or best friend who had been with you through thick and thin... a-a-a-and was not even interested in impressing them for your sake, would you feel good about pursuing a relationship with this man? Then how could you want to be in a committed relationship with a man who has no interest in God? What do you have to share between you? If God is truly an integral part of your life, this could definitely limit your conversation because you would not have a lot in common. It would be like being a tourist in France and not speaking French. You would not have a very enjoyable vacation without the ability to communicate. Conversation is key to intimacy. It is part of the experience of "knowing" the fullness of a person. If your exchange is limited, how close can you really get?

True joy is found in relationships that provoke you to higher heights in Christ and deeper depths of personal growth. This can only happen when both people are reading from the same book. Otherwise you will have conflict, distraction, confusion, and disappointment. It is like mixing linen and cotton together. They pull against one another and ruin the shape of the outfit. One has a looser weave. It doesn't have the same amount of strength to withstand wear.

I watched two strong healthy men the other day walking a very aged, bent-over woman across the street. These two men, who literally formed a yoke to support this dear lady, were reduced to walking at a snail's pace because of her weakened condition. That is the problem with being unequally yoked. The stronger has to suffer for the weaknesses of the other. The weak one is just...well, weak. He will not be pulled or stretched beyond what he is capable of doing with his own strength.

So you marry an unbeliever, thinking it will be fine. All of a sudden, now that you are married, you want to strengthen your relationship with God. Your husband's not interested. You want to go to church. He's not going for it. You want to tithe. He's definitely not going for that! You have children. They are confused. Why do they have to go to church if Daddy doesn't have to? Meanwhile, you hit every prayer chain you can to implore others to pray for your husband's salvation. You are married but your loneliness kills the joy of it all. It's happened too many times to count. At the end of the day, I have to ask you how deep is your love for Christ if intimacy with an unbeliever is not uncomfortable for you. You cannot serve two masters—you will love one and despise the other.

The Bible tells us that men and women ruin their lives with their foolish choices and then are angry with God. Joyless and frustrated, they wonder why God "allowed" this or that to happen. He allows you to exercise the free will He gave you, but He is hoping you love and trust Him enough to be obedient to His Word, to believe He knows what's best for you. Just as you can't bank on money that is not at hand, you cannot count on that man changing. Missionary dating is not the answer. You cannot save him. Wait on the Lord and (again I say) wait for the man He has chosen for you.

No Compromise

If you are completely sold out for Christ and able to stand firm in your convictions, you can be a mighty influence in an unsaved man's life. This only works, however, if you keep your standard of godliness intact. I personally have had several male friends in my life who were unsaved when we first met. I firmly believe that God allows people into our lives for a purpose, so I did not cancel them out, but neither did I embrace them. I continued walking toward the Lord, figuring they would either join me or

grow weary of the journey. They hung around until they figured out that I was not going to compromise myself, and then they settled into being great big brothers and supportive friends. All of these men are now mightily saved and point to me as the catalyst for their conversion. This is your calling as a woman of God, to be a light to all who walk in darkness, including men.

I also have several friends who had unsaved men in their lives that they refused to compromise for. Their refusal to be less than what God had asked them to be catapulted their men into the arms of Jesus, so determined were they to win these ladies' affections. They agreed to being mentored by other godly brothers and grew in the Lord by leaps and bounds. They are now happily married. But again, the key here is not compromising your walk with the Lord!

Warning: If you know you cannot be strong, do not try this at home. Again I say: Wait on the Lord to send you a man after His own heart.

Get on Board

Now I want you to realize that the head of every man is Christ, and the head of the woman is man, and the head of Christ is God.

1 C ORINTHIANS 11:3

For a man indeed ought not to cover his head, forasmuch as he is the image and glory of God: but the woman is the glory of the man.

1 C ORINTHIANS 11:7 KJV

One more reason to hold out for a man who is saved. If a man is to be the head over me, I definitely want him to be able to hear from God, don't you? You want a man who not only hears from God but also obeys Him. That will make your life a lot easier on all levels. If he hears and obeys God, then he will love you and lead you the way he should. You will have no problem submitting to him because you trust his judgment. Because you submit, he will love you more and do more things to please you. It is an endless circle of love when everyone is in the right place with God.

If you are presently experiencing problems with the other "S" word (that would be submission), you need to clear that up now before you get married. Understand there is nothing passive about submission. It is an active decision on your part to walk in cooperation with your partner, your boss, your father, your pastor, the person in line in front of you, the stop sign...we submit a hundred times a day without thinking about it and then get crazy when asked to submit to the one we supposedly love. Submission puts you in the position to be blessed, to get where you want to go in life, and avoid needless collisions. To submit to your husband is to submit to Christ. Do it in obedience to His Word, and He will bless you for it even when it is not noted by your partner.

Once submission is in place in a marriage, both people flourish in the relationship. The woman is happy and thriving, which makes her husband look good. She is his crowning glory, the evidence of his work well done. When the man looks good, then God looks good as the world looks on two people who are manifesting the glory of God through a beautiful partnership. As we consider submission in this light, it becomes a bigger issue than saying, "Yes, dear." It is about living your life to the glory of God.

A Woman of Value

A wife of noble character who can find? She is worth far more than rubies. Her husband has full confidence in her and lacks nothing of value. She brings him good, not harm, all the days of her life.

PROVERBS 31:10-12

Adam named his wife Eve, because she would become the mother of all the living.

GENESIS 3:20

Never underestimate the value of a woman. Never underestimate how much a man will appreciate you if you are on your mark. Funny her looks are never mentioned in the dissertation on the Proverbs 31 woman, but her qualities are. She is called many things: noble, virtuous (which means excellent), valuable, a safe haven, an organizer, a homemaker, a hardworker, successful businesswoman, kind, gracious, giving, nurturing, inspiring, on and on. And after praising all of her virtues, her husband blesses her. Her children bless her. There is no doubt who the wheel in the middle of the wheel is at their house. She was not superwoman, but she was prized in the eyes of her family.

In spite of Eve's drastic mistake of serving the wrong fruit for dinner, and despite what it cost her and Adam, he still saw her potential and chose to bless her and give her a name of honor: "mother of all living things" or "life-giver." The memory of better days before the Fall had already cemented her image in his mind and caused him to love her no matter how she had trespassed. She had brought new life to his world when she entered it. That image could never be challenged no matter how many difficult times they would go through. What do you want the man in your life to call you? Work toward becoming that woman in preparation for the one who God brings. Cultivate your gifts as a woman from the inside out. Grow in wisdom and grace. The Proverbs 31 woman did not become an amazing woman overnight. She dealt with each season of her life by applying herself fully to it and understanding her purpose in the moment in which she lived. She used each season to her benefit to become a woman that her family would bless. As a single woman, you have the awesome opportunity to do the same.

Now should not be a sad or idle time. It should be a time of great investment in your future. Use it wisely redeem the time joyfully sow practical and spiritual seeds in your garden, and expect a rich harvest. You too will rise up one day and be called blessed by the man you love if you prepare yourself now.

You are the delight of the Lord. The more you tap into feeling that delight, the more delightful you will feel. His presence and love will become real to you and fill you to the point where, I dare say, you will become rather ambivalent on the topic of marriage. "Do I want to or not?" 'you will ask yourself. "I'm not really sure." You will have to give pause for the thought because once you discover what peace and joy really feels like, you hesitate

to introduce anything into your life that might have the slightest potential to spoil it. I'm a witness that you can actually swing to the other extreme.

I have had people tell me they think I'm just a little too happy being single for my own good! However, I feel that this is exactly where God wants us to be. Reveling in the fact we are His beloved. We are His betrothed. Delight in His occupation of our land. We belong to someone from the inside out. Our natural status on the earth has nothing to do with who we are! You better get a clue on how desirable you are and walk in that thing, girl! It's time to get real, get free, and get happy! So slay the idol of marriage. Get over it. Then, when the right man comes along, you can really get into it because you will see exactly where you are going and be able to find your way there safely and joyfully

1. Happiness is external, joy is internal and comes directly from God.

Do not grieve, for the joy of the L ORD is your strength. (Nehemiah 8:10)

1. The word of God fills our heart with joy. Following His word cleanses us from guilt and shame. His clear direction leads us to the path of joyful living.

The precepts of the LORD are right, giving joy to the heart. The commands of the LORD are radiant, giving light to the eyes. (Psalm 19:8)

1. The Holy Spirit surrounds us and keeps us centered in kingdom living—pleasure and joy. Because we are in right relationship with God, we have peace which is always accompanied by joy

For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit... (Romans 14:17)

1. Trusting in the Lord increases our joy because we are at peace with God and His intentions toward us. The Holy Spirit continually encourages us as we wait for all that God has in store for us.

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (Romans 15:13)

1. Joy comes from feeling you've accomplished something at the end of the day. From reaping your harvest. Seeing the seeds of hard work and labors of love bearing fruit.

For the Lord your God will bless you in all your harvest and in all the work of your hands, and your joy will be complete. (Deuteronomy 16:15)

1. Joy comes from knowing that your loving obedience brings pleasure to God and intimacy with Jesus. When He draws close, He fills us with His joy.

As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. If you obey my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have obeyed my Father's commands and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. (John 15:9-11)

1. Joy comes from answered prayer. The secret to answered prayer? Praying in the will of the Father. The secret to praying in the will of the Father? Tapping into His heart, mind, and will through sweet and intimate communion.

Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you will receive, and your joy will be complete. (John 16:24)

1. Joy comes from fellowship with other believers who have the same witness as yourself about Jesus.

We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ. We write this to make our joy complete. (1 John 1:3-4)

1. In the midst of God's awesome presence there is joy. Everything else is diminished in light of all that He is—trouble, lack, life and its pressures—all seem strangely inconsequential.

Splendor and majesty are before him; strength and joy in his dwelling place. (1 Chronicles 16:27)

1. When we see God as He is, we will discover the true source of pleasure—Jesus. When we see Him, our joy will be complete.

You have made known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand. (Psalm 16:11)

1. In this world, we will have sorrow and tribulation, but these are the prerequisites to recognizing and experiencing true joy. No pain, no gain.

Those who sow in tears will reap with songs of joy. (Psalm 126:5)

1. God collects all of our tears and pours them out to make streams in the desert of our hearts. As we lift our voices in worship to Him, the path to joy becomes clearer.

The LORD will surely comfort Zion and will look with compassion on all her ruins; he will make her deserts like Eden, her wastelands like the garden of the LORD. Joy and gladness will be found in her, thanksgiving and the sound of singing. (Isaiah 51:3)

1. Not feeling joyful right now? This too shall pass. As you wait on Him through your season of weeping, His promise to you is sure and you can expect Him to do as He has said.

He will yet fill your mouth with laughter and your lips with shouts of joy. (Job 8:21)

1. Peace is the precursor to joy. It is the place of release to celebrate that all in your world is settled. Don't give your heart permission to be anxious. The end—by God. Therefore get happy, God's got it!

Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled... (John 14:27 KJV)

1. The ultimate joy is in knowing that you are beloved and betrothed. It is simply a matter of time for the manifestation. God's love for you is unending. It cannot be interrupted. It cannot be stolen. He will always be faithful, even when you are faithless. He longs to fill your every desire and make you wholly complete in Him. Begin to thank God ahead of time, praise ushers in the blessing of joy.

There will be heard once more the sounds of joy and gladness, the voices of bride and bridegroom, and the voices of those who bring thank-offerings to the house of the LORD, saying, "Give thanks to the LORD Almighty, for the LORD is good; his love endures for ever." (Jeremiah 33:10-11)

Have you noticed in all of these meditations that a man was never the source of joy? It's not about you, it's not about him, it's all about Jesus, your fiancé. Prepare for a wedding day on high! As you wait in joyous expectation on Him delivering all that He has promised, through the partnering of His Word and your faithful obedience, joy will come and attract all that you desire without all of the wearisome labor. God will wipe away your tears and fill your mouth with laughter, laughter that will be

contagious. Then your joy will be complete 'cause you'll be downright happy from the inside out. This thing called joy can become a habit if you are consistent in your walk as a single person. Soon others will notice the change in you, and they won't be able to resist asking, "Girl, you sure are looking sassy and satisfied these days. Aren't you still single? How did you get so happy?" And you, in turn, will flash your most brilliant smile and say, "Ooo, I'm so glad you asked me that. Have I got news for you!"
